

John (Jack) C.T. Johnson Memorial Bursary Information

In 2008, the CVR Educational Foundation established the John (Jack) C.T. Johnson Memorial Bursary with a very generous legacy from the Estate of Jack Johnson.

Jack Johnson spent his life teaching in the Chateauguay Valley. He was involved in the Quebec Teachers' Union as President and also taught overseas for the Department of National Defense. Upon his retirement, he became a clergyman where he looked after the Anglican ministry in Ormstown and Hemmingford and other southwestern Quebec communities.

Each year, two bursaries of \$500 each are awarded to 2 graduating students. Students must by pursuing post-secondary education, have a good attitude to achieve, be involved at school and in the community and have a financial need. Students apply for the bursary following the criteria and guidelines set out by the CVR Educational Foundation. Applications are subjected to a blind review and recipients are awarded the 2 bursaries at the graduation ceremonies at the end of the school year.

Recipients receive 2 equal installments in September and in January, provided they confirm full-time attendance in a post-secondary institution.
